EDUM 520 EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY

COURSE OVERVIEW

In this course, you will investigate fourteen separate clusters of instruction related to the field of educational psychology.

This is a 4-credit-hour course and allotted 6 weeks of time.

EDUM 530

THEORIES OF DEVELOPMENT CONCEPTS AND APPLICATIONS

COURSE OVERVIEW

This course is a masters level course in understanding the development educational theories and the research that support them. In the course, you will learn the framework and principles that explores the various theories supporting how the brain process learning. The course will cover the history, neuroscience of learning, and will highlight current educational perspectives on the learning process. This is a 4-credit-hour course and allotted 6 weeks of time.

EDUM 540 HUMAN DIVERSITY

COURSE OVERVIEW

In the course, you will examine the principles that impact how society understands learning patterns and behaviors between racial, gender, and social classes. The course provides an integrated look on terms such as multiculturalism, pluralism, and interculturalism and these terms influence societal thoughts about learning. When you complete this course, you will gain new perspectives on how society has learned. This is a 4-credit-hour course and allotted 6 weeks of time.

EDUM 544 EDUCATION LAW

COURSE OVERVIEW

We will even take a walk through the side of administration which is unfamiliar to quite a few administrators. This is a 4-credit-hour course and allotted 6 weeks of time.

FOUNDATIONS OF EDUCATION

COURSE OVERVIEW

It also provides opportunities to examine and analyze important aspects of your own educational system regardless of where you operate and regardless of the prevailing cultural, ideological and material backgrounds. Topics will be discussed from various theoretical and ideological perspectives. Consequently, there will be scope for you to argue or present your situation from a perspective of your own choosing. As this is a graduate course, it is important, however, for you to be open-minded and receptive to other perspectives even if you do not agree with them. Examination of topics will occur largely within the context of perspectives on education. This is a 4-credit-hour course and allotted 6 weeks of time.

EDUM 570

THE USES OF TECHNOLOGY IN EDUCATION

COURSE OVERVIEW

This is an advanced course that prepares you to work effectively in the elementary classroom using technology. In this course you will learn how to successfully integrate technology into your lessons. When finished you will have a grasp of the fundamental concepts of using technology effectively in an elementary classroom. This is a 4-credit-hour course and allotted 6 weeks of time.

PHILOSOPHY OF EDUCATION

COURSE OVERVIEW

The Philosophy of Education is an exciting course that provides an opportunity to examine some of the important ideas of the major thinkers on education who have influenced the development of our education systems. These ideas address issues of educational practice and policy. The course will provide opportunities for you to develop a reasoned philosophy of education. The course will also provide opportunities to examine and analyze important aspects of your own educational system regardless of where you operate and regardless of the prevailing cultural, ideological and material backgrounds. As this is a graduate course, it is important for you to be open-minded and receptive to the perspectives presented even if you do not agree with them. This is a 4-credit-hour course and allotted 6 weeks of time.

EDUM 590

EDUCATION ASSESSMENT

COURSE OVERVIEW

This is an advanced course that prepares you to effectively assess students in the classroom using various methods. In this course you will learn how to successfully create assessments that are valid, reliable, and varied. When finished you will have a grasp of the fundamental concepts of creating student assessments in an elementary classroom. This is a 4-credit-hour course and allotted 6 weeks of time.

RESEARCH METHODS

COURSE OVERVIEW

This class will provide an analysis of business problems and the use of scientific research as a problem-solving tool. This encompasses the understanding and application of appropriate research designs, research statistics, and the use of the computer for data analyses, and report writing and presentation. This is a 4-credit-hour course and allotted 6 weeks of time.

Leadership personnel in special education. Public policy and special education. This is a 4-credit-hour course and allotted 6 weeks of time.

EDUD 973 EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP

This is an upper level course that prepares you to work in the field of Educational Administration, superintendent.
